Each newsletter we will be spotlighting a local Weston business to give you the scoop. This time, your local auto body repair and painting shop which was established in 1985, Crozier Body Shop. This business is owned by Bob Ackerman, and managed by Sandy Heilman. We took this opportunity to ask Mr. Ackerman some questions about the business and memories of Weston.

Q: What inspired you to start your own business, and what tips/advice do you have for new business

This month, The District wraps up the \$900,000 sewer project in Weston. Sewer work is almost complete, then crews will begin paving and restoration. The project is expected to be complete by the end of this month.

## OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR WESTON VILLAGE RESIDENTS

- ❖ <u>A Friendly Reminder:</u> *Please keep your sidewalks free and clear of snow and ice this winter.* Sidewalks within the Village that are not cleared of snow and ice of two inches or more within 24 hours of any storm are considered a public nuisance. The Village Administrator or his designee may have such non-compliant sidewalks cleared at the Village's expense and then bill the property owner for these charges. If said charges are not paid within 30 days, they may be assessed to the owner's property taxes. Your cooperation this winter is greatly appreciated.
- Residents are to keep weeds/grass in the front yard, rear yard, side yard, and verge/boulevard (right-of-ways); around poles, signs, curbs, fences, trees and other obstacles trimmed and under a height of seven (7) inches. Please keep yard debris (grass clippings, leaves, etc.) out of the roads and storm sewers.
- Did you know you can reduce landfill waste by mulching leaves? Mulching/shredding leaves with a mulching mower is faster and easier than raking. The decomposing leaves will act as a natural fertilizer and weed control agent. If you are looking for ground cover the Village can provide leaves from leaf pickup to those in need. Contact the Village Office for more details.
- Is your neighborhood being overrun by stray cats? There is no easy solution when it comes to stray cats. Instead, the entire community does need to come together to address the cats. A trap-neuter-return is the only humane and effective approach to community cat problems. The Wood County Humane Society does offer low cost spay/neuter for community/feral cats at \$35/cat (which also includes rabies vaccine and ear tip); for more details visit: wchumane.org. Humane Ohio (located in Toledo) also offers low cost spay/neuter for stray/feral cats in a trap at \$29/cat (which also includes rabies vaccine and ear tip); for more details visit humaneohio,org.
- Animals in public places are to be kept leashed at all times. Clean up after your pet, waste bags are provided at the public parks.
- Permits are required when erecting any new building or structure or to relocate, enlarge or substantially alter any existing building, structure, or land; new permanent fence and/or change of configuration; providing or connecting onto a water supply or sewage disposal facility; and chickens. All permits must have a detailed drawing attached and be completed by the property owner or signed letter of consent by the property owner. - Weston Church of Christ Community Food Pantry begins September 4, 2021. For Wood County residents only! Open to the public every 1st and 3rd Saturday from 10:00AM-Noon. Pantry is located at 13355 Center Street, use Elm Street grade-level entrance.
- Family Fun Nights (for all ages) at Weston Church of Christ 2nd and 4th Fridays from 6:30-9PM; assorted board and card games, food, beverages.
- TeamKids will begin Wednesday, September 8th at Sonlight Church & Community Center. TeamKids will be every Wednesday from 6:30-8PM.
- The 24/7 dumpsters at the park on Broadway are for RECYCLING ONLY, no trash! All cardboard is required to be broken down, flattened and placed in the assigned bin. Bagged items must be emptied, bags are not accepted. If the bins are full, come back after they are emptied on

Wednesdays. Do not leave items outside of the bins. Please read the labels before emptying your recyclables, contaminants in the bins may cause a whole route to end up in the landfill. Those who do not follow the recycling guidelines will be caught and prosecuted. Report illegal dumping to the Solid Waste District at 419-354-9297. For more details on recycling, visit www.recyclewoodcounty.org.

- If you plan on digging or moving earth in any way, call 8-1-1 or OHIO811 at 1-800-362-2764, at least 48 hours but not more than 10 days, before digging so utilities can mark their facilities. It's free and it's the law! Brochures on Natural Gas Safety and Safe Excavation practices are available at the Village Hall.
- ❖ A reminder from the Sheriff: In the event that you witness something suspicious, don't hesitate to contact the Sheriff's office. If you call as an incident is taking place instead of waiting to report it, deputies can be on the scene in a matter of minutes. In the event of an emergency, dial 911. For non-emergency calls, dial 419-354-9001.
